Pembroke- The Lumbee Tribe Elections Board certified the 2005 election announcing **Sharon Hunt** as the winner in District 2; **Pam Spaulding** in District 3; **John Lowery** in District 5; **Frances Chavis** in District 6; **Wendy Moore-Graham** in District 7; **Richard Locklear** in District 11 and **Shelly Strickland** in District 12.

Former council member Sherry Carter opted not to seek re-election, resulting in an uncontested election in District 11 for Richard Locklear. Frances Chavis, District 6, was the only council member to be re-elected in this election.

The newly elected council members were sworn in at the January 19 council meeting and will serve a three-year term.
