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2 **I. CALL TO ORDER**

3 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Everybody up front. They tell me  
4 it's 6:30, at this is time I'll call our Lumbee Tribal meeting  
5 -- Council meeting to order, and we'd ask you to please stand  
6 and ask Brother Lesaundri to lead us in prayer.

7 **II. INVOCATION**

8 LESAUNDRI HUNT: Father, as we begin this meeting  
9 tonight we ask that, God, you would touch our minds and our  
10 hearts as we come and reason together according to the  
11 scripture. We ask, Father, that you bless each and every family  
12 member. Touch those that are not present tonight maybe because  
13 of sickness or some other problems.

14 We just ask, Lord, that you will touch our people,  
15 touch our tribe. Guide us and direct us, touch our leaders,  
16 touch our chairman, the Tribal Council, all entities that is  
17 involved in the making of the tribe of the Lumbee people. We  
18 ask to bless each and every member. Father, we ask and pray in  
19 Jesus' name, Amen.  
20

21 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: We'd ask Mr. Townsend to lead us  
22 in our Pledge of Allegiance.  
23

24 **III. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

25 LARRY TOWNSEND: Join us in our Pledge of  
Allegiance please.

"I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States

1 of America, And to the republic for which it stands. One  
2 nation, under God, indivisible with liberty and justice for  
3 all."

4 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: We'd ask Mr.

5 **IV. PREAMBLE**

6 LAKISHIA SWEAT: (Led preamble.)

7 "In accordance with the inherent power of self-  
8 governance of the Lumbee tribe of North Carolina, the Tribe  
9 adopts this Constitution for the purposes of establishing a  
10 tribal government structure, preserving for all time the Lumbee  
11 way of life and our community, promoting the educational,  
12 cultural, social, and economic well-being of Lumbee People, and  
13 securing justice and freedom for the Lumbee people.  
14

15 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: You may be seated. Madame  
16 Secretary, roll call.

16 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Thank you. At this time I'd like  
17 to welcome everyone here tonight and a lot of special guests, so  
18 I will just say all of you are special guests, to discuss the  
19 new tribal business for the tribal people.

20 **V. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

21 If you would, Council, look at your agenda. I would  
22 entertain a motion that we approve tonight's.

23 LARRY TOWNSEND: Move we adopt.

24 JONATHAN LOCKLEAR: Second.

25 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: All in favor say "Aye".

(Ayes were given in favor of the motion.)

1 (Motion "1" to approve and adopt agenda passes.)

2 **VII. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF JUNE TRIBAL COUNCIL**

3 **MINUTES AND ACTIONS**

4 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: You can see that in the June  
5 minutes we don't have any July minutes. So what is your wishes  
6 on the June minutes?

7 LESAUNDRI HUNT: I make a motion to approve.

8 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: A motion to approve the June  
9 minutes.

10 LARRY TOWNSEND: Second.

11 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: All in favor let me know and say  
12 "Aye".

13 (Ayes were given in favor of the motion.)

14 (Motion "2" to approve June minutes passes.)

15 **VIII. JULY TRIBAL COUNCIL MINUTES - NO QUORUM**

16 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: And it will be on your agenda,  
17 there is no July minutes.

18 **IX. COMMUNITY COMMENTS**

19 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: At this time, we will have our  
20 community comments, and before I call those up I'd just like to  
21 remind you again that your comments should -- you should state  
22 your name and what district you're from and the purpose of your  
23 comments. And also remember, no name calling, no disorderly  
24 comments or negative comments.  
25

Let's just -- whatever your issue is tell us about it

1 and leave personality out. Tell us your name and what district  
2 you are from.

3 Mr. Eddie? Mr. Eddie Locklear.

4 EDDIE LOCKLEAR: Mr. Speaker and members of the  
5 Lumbee Tribe Council, thank you for allowing me to speak with  
6 you this evening. My name is Eddie Locklear and I live in  
7 District 3.

8 Tonight, I will share with you information about a new  
9 group that is being organized to support the work of the Tribal  
10 Council. The name of the group is Lumbee Community Involvement  
11 and Engagement. The group is designed to involve all Lumbees  
12 who are enrolled members of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina.  
13

14 The primary purpose of the group is to support  
15 transparency, accountability, prevent tyranny within our tribal  
16 government, and support the vision of what our newly elected  
17 Tribal Chairman describes as Lumbee core values.

18 Our primary strategy to achieve our work is to provide  
19 an open forum for Lumbees to get more involved and engaged with  
20 their tribal government. We will do this by allowing them to  
21 discuss issues among themselves, provide an organized  
22 communication link to the Lumbee Tribal Council members and  
23 Tribal Chairman, and provide an opportunity for us to discuss  
24 issues among the Lumbee people.  
25

We plan to offer suggestions to our Tribal Council  
members and Chairman that they may used to help them be more

1 responsive and supportive of all Lumbees, especially those who  
2 feel that they do not currently have a voice in their tribal  
3 government.

4 Lumbee Community Involvement and Engagement consists  
5 of a steering committee and an eight-part team. The teams are  
6 Economic Development, Finances, Constitution and Ordinances,  
7 Federal Recognition, Ethics, Housing, Health and Human  
8 Resources, and Education. We decided to align our work teams  
9 with the Tribal Council committees. We decided it was not  
10 appropriate to have a tribal administration work team.

11 Our goal is to support the work of the Tribal Council  
12 committees and help communicate their work to the Lumbee people.  
13 We will provide input to the tribal administration committee if  
14 requested. The steering committee will guide the work and the  
15 development of the eight teams.

16 Our objectives are to inform the community of policy  
17 direction of the Lumbee Tribal government, following people in  
18 communities as part of a process to developing government  
19 policies and build community awareness and understanding,  
20 involve people in a range of mechanisms to insure that issues  
21 and concerns are understood and considered as part of the  
22 decision-making process, collaborate with the community by  
23 developing partnerships, and formulate options and provide a  
24 recommendation, and empower people in communities to make  
25 decisions, and to implement and manage teams.



1           We hope to involve hundreds of Lumbee people in our  
2 work of the teams. Thank you again for allowing me to be here  
3 this evening to speak with you. If any member would like to  
4 have additional information, I do have a handout that I'll be  
5 happy to provide to you after the meeting. Thanks again, Mr.  
6 Speaker.

7           SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Thank you, Mr. Eddie.

8           Lynn Jacobs.

9           LYNN JACOBS: Mr. Chairman and honorable council  
10 members, since last month I've spent a considerable amount of  
11 time riding through our communities. Mr. Locklear just spoke of  
12 this new group they're coming up with. Sounds like they're  
13 trying to take your jobs away.

14           Really, our people are disappearing. You go through  
15 the communities, you don't see Indians, you just see people.  
16 Why? You go around and you ask them, when's the last time you  
17 seen your Council member? I don't even know who it is.

18           You meet here -- y'all do -- to govern our people.  
19 You meet in your communities to let your people tell you how to  
20 govern them. Our people are disappearing people. You alk about  
21 federal recognition. If you look down and you don't see no  
22 Indians you're not going to get recognized.

23           We've got to turn around. You've got to start walking  
24 the walk, not just trying to talk it. In the end, we will be  
25 just another government.

1 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Thank you, Mr. Jacobs. Mr. Robie  
2 Goins.

3 ROBIE GOINS: Thank you, thank you. Robie Goins, I'm  
4 in District 4. I come to you today to talk about the Atlantic  
5 Coast Pipeline. I don't know if you're familiar with the  
6 pipeline that is going to be constructed here in Robeson County  
7 as well as other neighboring counties.

8 Basically this is a 555 -- 550 mile infrastructure  
9 coming from West Virginia, going through Virginia, and coming  
10 through North Carolina. It will basically connect the metering  
11 station there at Prospect and go up into Nash County and Halifax  
12 Counties and things like that to connect to a compressor  
13 station.  
14

15 There's many risks associated with this pipeline. Data  
16 has shown that the pipelines built in recent years are failing  
17 at a similar rate to old pipelines that were built in the 40's.  
18 The reasons for this is they're building the pipelines so quick,  
19 they don't have as much oversight, and it's -- it's just a  
20 problem there.

21 There's close proximity to residential areas and this  
22 could cause homeowner's insurance and other detrimental effects  
23 on the market value of nearby properties. There's several  
24 environmental and health concerns associated with this pipeline,  
25 and there's a total of I think 250,000 feet of pipeline that  
would cross our wetlands, and really this pipeline isn't

1 necessary.

2           Studies have shown that -- Duke and Dominion and  
3 Piedmont Natural Gas are the major players in this -- have shown  
4 that there's an increase -- the increase of gas supply capacity  
5 is a justification for the ACP isn't true. Studies suggest that  
6 the utilities do not need this gas and they have contracted for  
7 and that the pipeline would go underutilized. That's a few of  
8 the talking points.

9           I know that ACP actually had some tables setup for the  
10 Julian T. Pierce Art Gallery show for the homecoming, and they  
11 did donate to our Julian T. Pierce fund. So they're already in  
12 our communities. They're going onto these landowner's  
13 properties without permission, they're surveying, they're  
14 bringing companies in from Ohio, Illinois, places like that, and  
15 the homeowner's and landowner's don't know anything about it.

16           They're misinforming the community about the hazards and  
17 they're talking to our County Commissioners, getting  
18 resolutions. They only need 40 percent of the landowners to  
19 pass -- to pass this and to get this pipeline put in, and I'm  
20 asking for the Council to somehow help the community get more  
21 awareness of this, help with the talking of the landowners and  
22 surrounding property owners to try to basically stop this  
23 pipeline.  
24

          We don't need it, it's harmful to us, and --

JARROD LOWERY: Thank you, Mr. Goins.

1 ROBIE GOINS: Thank you.

2 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Mr. Goins, Mr. Al raise your hand.  
3 This gentlemen right here, after the meeting if you would get up  
4 with him. If you'd like to go into more detail, he's the  
5 Chairman of our Economics Development. If they -- if he wants  
6 to invite you to one of his committee meetings and then you can  
7 give a little more detail. I know three minutes is not enough.

8 ROBIE GOINS: Okay.

9 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: So, that will be Mr. Al, if he  
10 wants to.

11 ROBIE GOINS: I appreciate it, thank you.

12 **X. COMMITTEE REPORTS**

13 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: At this time we will move into out  
14 committee reports. Our first report is the Finance. Ms. Janie,  
15 but I believe you will direct it it to ---

16 JANIE McFARLAND: Yes.

17 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: -- to Ms. Anita. Ms. Anita at  
18 this time we'll -- we'll give you the mic.

19 **FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT**

20 ANITA BLANKS: This is a Tribal Banking Finance and  
21 Real Property ordinance. It's CLL0-2016-0816-01. We have  
22 discussed this at length in our committee meetings. This  
23 documents come out of committee. I am under the assumption  
24 everybody has read this document and I would ask if anybody has  
25 any questions concerning it.

1 (No questions presented.)

2 Then as it comes out of committee, I make a motion  
3 that we approve this document.

4 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Motion has been made. Do we have  
5 a second?

6 AREATHA PATTERSON: I second it.

7 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Discussion?

8 JANET LOCKLEAR: Mr. Speaker, Section 5 in  
9 reference to this ordinance, I would like to add a sentence at  
10 the end. And I'd like to add all funds received by the Tribe  
11 shall be reported to the Tribal Council within 30 days of  
12 receipt to be budgeted.

13  
14 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Exactly where's that going to be  
15 at in there so everybody can flip to it.

16 JANET LOCKLEAR: At the very end of Section 5 under  
17 reporting.

18 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: You got that Ms. Anita so you can  
19 add that?

20 ANITA BLANKS: Yes.

21 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: So, it is amended with that  
22 addition. I suggest you to quote it one more time please. Pull  
23 your mic down.

24 JANET LOCKLEAR: All funds received by the Tribal  
25 Council shall be reported to the -- I'm sorry. I'm sorry, let  
me repeat it.

1 All funds received by the Tribe shall be reported to  
2 the Council within 30 days of receipt to be budgeted.

3 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Everybody see that amendment? And  
4 you are offering that as a motion. Who did we get a second  
5 from? Ms. Anita, you seconded?

6 AREATHA PATTERSON: I seconded it.

7 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: We got a motion and a second.  
8 Roll call on this.

9 JAN LOWERY: Lakishia Swett?

2 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Okay, the motion passed so we have  
3 adopted that ordinance.

4 Our next committee report is Constitution and  
5 Ordinance Committee. Mr. Larry Townsend.

6 **CONSTITUTION AND ORDINANCE COMMITTEE**

7 LARRY TOWNSEND: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I have  
8 two items to come before you tonight.

9  
10 CLLR-2016-0818-01 dated August 18, 2016, subject the  
11 reappointment to the North Carolina Indian Housing Authority.  
12 This resolution, I will read the -- the last -- I'll read the  
13 two therefores.

14 "Therefore, be it resolved that the Lumbee Tribal  
15 Council of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina does hereby  
16 support the nominee of Mr. Alton Locklear for reappointment to  
17 the North Carolina Indian Housing Board.

18 "Therefore be it further resolved upon swearing in  
19 Alton Locklear, he will serve a five-year term on the North --  
20 on the NC Indian Housing Board."

21 This resolution coming forward requires no second from  
22 the committee. I move the adoption.

23  
24 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Any questions of Mr. Townsend  
25 before we have a roll call on this? Like he said, it's coming  
from a committee so it really doesn't need a second, so.

20 before the committee -- or before the Tribal Council.

21 Ordinance Number -- this will be an amendment to  
22 Ordinance Number 2002-001, the original ordinance being dated  
23 May 16, 2002.

24 I will skip the -- I'll skip down to the part that  
25 we're changing, which is going to be in section 1.

1           “The Chairperson shall have ten days from the date an  
2 ordinance is submitted to sign it, otherwise the ordinance is  
3 considered as approved by the Chairperson.”

4           This motion comes from the committee, it does not need  
5 a second for your approval for this ordinance.

6           SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Mr. Townsend, would you go over  
7 what the original ordinance stated so that we can make sure  
8 we’re clear on what we’re changing.

9           LARRY TOWNSEND:       The original ordinance would read:

10           “The Chairperson shall have thirty days from the date  
11 an ordinance is submitted to sign it, otherwise the ordinance is  
12 considered vetoed by the Chairperson.”

13           We’re changing the thirty days to ten business days.

14           SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Questions?

15           JARROD LOWERY: One clarification, Mr. Speaker.

16           SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Go ahead.

17           JARROD LOWERY: In the amendment it says Chairperson  
18 shall have ten days, but the presenter Chairman said --  
19 Chairperson said ten business days. Can we offer a friendly  
20 amendment where it says ten business days?  
21

22           LARRY TOWNSEND:       Yes.

23           JARROD LOWERY: Ten business days.

24           LARRY TOWNSEND:       Is that a friendly amendment?

25           JARROD LOWERY: Yes.

          SPEAKER BREWINGTON: So, that’s change rather than

1 saying ten days, it's ten business days. So, excluding  
2 Saturdays and Sundays?

3 LARRY TOWNSEND: Right, and the holiday would not  
4 be --

5 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: So, not holidays. If the tribal  
6 office is open it's -- it's business days. Is that a good  
7 explanation for it?

8 Okay. Roll call.

11 we don't -- if we don't finish Monday night and Tuesday night.

12 JANIE MCFARLAND: We'll cancel that.

13 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: We'll cancel that. Okay, now what  
14 about the 29th and the 30th?

15 JANIE MCFARLAND: Well let's leave it and we'll  
16 cancel if we need to.

17 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: So as soon as we finish the budget  
18 she's saying that we'll cancel all those other obligated dates.  
19 I don't think we got any -- any room for August unless  
20 somebody's just eager to meet.

21 No motions for September.

22 REGINALD OXENDINE: Has anything changed yet on the  
23 calendar.

24 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: No, no.

25 We will be notified if the budget is completed and we

1 don't need the addition meetings.

2 LARRY TOWNSEND: Mr. Speaker?

3 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Mr. Townsend.

4 LARRY TOWNSEND: I'd like to schedule a  
5 Constitution Committee meeting for September the 8th, that  
6 Thursday night at 6:30.

7 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Constitution, September the 8th at  
8 6:30. Any other Chairperson?

9 ALTON LOCKLEAR: Mr. Speaker, I'd like to schedule  
10 Economic Development at 7:30 on the same night.

12 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Economics on the 8th at 7:30. Any  
13 other committee need to meet?

14 FRANK COOPER: Mr. Speaker. Education and Culture on  
15 the 6th at 6:30.

16 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Okay, on the 6th Education  
17 Committee at 6:30, Mr. Cooper?

18 FRANK COOPER: Yes, Sir.

19 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Okay, any other?

20 JANIE McFARLAND: I will have to have a budget  
21 hearing once we get the budget done, but I'm not going to  
22 schedule it until we're finished. We can add that and put it on  
23 the calendar.

24 SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Will that just be --

SPEAKER BREWINGTON: Held during the day, okay.
